The world famous Trent Bridge Cricket Ground in Nottingham will host the 2nd Royal London One Day International - England v West Indies, 21st September 2017

Location

Trent Bridge Cricket Ground, the world's third oldest Test Cricket venue is located to the south of Nottingham City Centre, just over 1 mile from the rail station. This iconic ground is well placed on the banks of the River Trent in West Bridgford and easily accessible by all modes of transport if you're travelling locally or from further afield.

Arriving by bus or tram

The most convenient tram stop for Trent Bridge is Nottingham Station; this is a 20 minute walk to the ground. NET is running a £2 return ticket for all match and season ticket holders. Tram customers can take advantage of free park and ride places at five sites across the city. The most convenient tram park & ride site can be found at Clifton South (17 minute tram travel time), stopping at Meadows Embankment, where spectators can then walk (around 20 minutes) along the river to Trent Bridge.

There are many buses that connect the city centre to Trent Bridge Cricket Ground via Nottingham rail station and from the city. The most frequent services operate every few minutes from Monday to Saturday. Look out for the Nottingham City Transport buses 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 from the City. Ticket holders will be able to travel on Nottingham City Transport buses for £2.50 (return) when they show a valid match ticket or Membership card to the driver. (Please note this offer is only valid on Nottingham City Transport buses in greater Nottingham, and after 9.30am).

The Trent Barton services Mainline, Rushcliffe Villager, The Cotgrave The Keyworth will also get you there, along with the Kinchbus 9, the Centrebus 19 and the Marshalls 90. You can buy a Robin Hood day ticket on all bus services passing the Cricket Ground for £4.50. For more information please visit www.robinhoodnetwork.co.uk.

The **FREE** Robin Hood Network integrated transport app can be downloaded from the Google Play Store or itunes which gives realtime information from your bus stop and lets you know exactly when the next bus is coming.

Audio and visual stop announcements inside all buses will inform you exactly where to get off.

Arriving on foot

If you live locally then walking to the event is the healthiest and cheapest way to get there. If you're not sure of the best route try www.walkit.com select 'Nottingham' from the drop down menu and type 'Trent Bridge Cricket Ground' into the destination box.

Cycling to the ground

Several cycle parking locations are within close proximity to the ground.

Arriving by train

Nottingham Train Station is around a 20 minute walk from Trent Bridge.

Driving to Trent Bridge

Using the Park and Ride (P&R)

If you are travelling from further afield then using one of the many tram, train or bus based P&R sites might be the best option. **N.B. Queen's Drive P&R closes at 8.30pm and Racecourse P&R closes at 7.45pm with last buses to both sites going from city at 7.30pm**
