

The Blaze are inviting applications for a Strength and Conditioning Coach to join the team. This role provides a fantastic opportunity to work as part of our Sport Science and Sport Medicine (SSSM) team and deliver high quality physical preparation to professional and pathway female cricketers.

Role Profile

Key responsibilities:

- Work collaboratively with staff to deliver physical preparation aligned to the performance and development objectives of the overriding programme, with autonomy for the academy and EPP programmes.
- Develop and implement a long-term athletic development model through the planning and coaching delivery of S&C programmes for academy and EPP players.
- High quality collaboration between pathway and professional players, including 2nd XI delivery.
- Provide coaches guidance to support cricket session planning to optimise skill progression.
- Collect, interpret and share bowling and throwing workload data with players and staff.
- Assist the medical team to plan and deliver high quality injury prevention and rehabilitation programmes to maximise player availability.
- Supervise and line manage the EPP S&C coach (placement student).
- Work collaboratively with stakeholders such as ECB and counties to support player performance and development goals.
- Complete regular player profiling in line with ECB protocols to inform programme design and physical development.
- Take ownership for and undertake appropriate professional development to keep abreast of world's best practice and current evidence-based research.
- To promote adherence to ethical guidelines and regulations with regard to drugs and doping in sport, in line with UK Anti-Doping (UKAD) guidelines.
- Actively work to promote the ECB Inspiring Generations and the Transform Women's and Girl's Action Plan.
- Undertake additional duties as requested by your line manager from time to time.
