Depending upon your availability you can become involved in activities and events that contribute to our overall aim of making cricket a game for everyone.

Supporting Nottinghamshire County Cricket Club Community Engagement Officer with activities. They will include:

- Talking to people about Cricket, including friends, family, local organisations, college students, university students and parents at school gates.
- Being involved in organising events in the community
- Taking part in promotional activity/information stalls or events
