TRENT BRIDGE TRAVEL INFORMATION

The world famous Trent Bridge cricket ground in Nottingham will host the second **Investec Test Match** between England and South Africa on 14-18 July, and a **Royal London One Day International** between England and the West Indies on 21 September.

LOCATION

Trent Bridge Cricket Ground - the world's third oldest Test Cricket venue - is located to the south of Nottingham city centre, just over a mile from the railway station. The iconic ground is well placed on the banks of the River Trent in West Bridgford, and easily accessible by all modes of transport.

ARRIVING ON FOOT

It's easy to walk to the ground from the city centre - simply search on [maps.google.com](https://www.google.com/maps) or [walkit.com](https://www.walkit.com) to find the best route from your location.

BUS OR TRAM

The tram stop at Nottingham Railway Station is just over a mile walk from Trent Bridge, and Nottingham Express Transit (NET) runs a £2 return ticket for all match and season ticket holders.

Regular buses also connect the city centre to Trent Bridge Cricket Ground via Nottingham Railway Station and from the city centre.

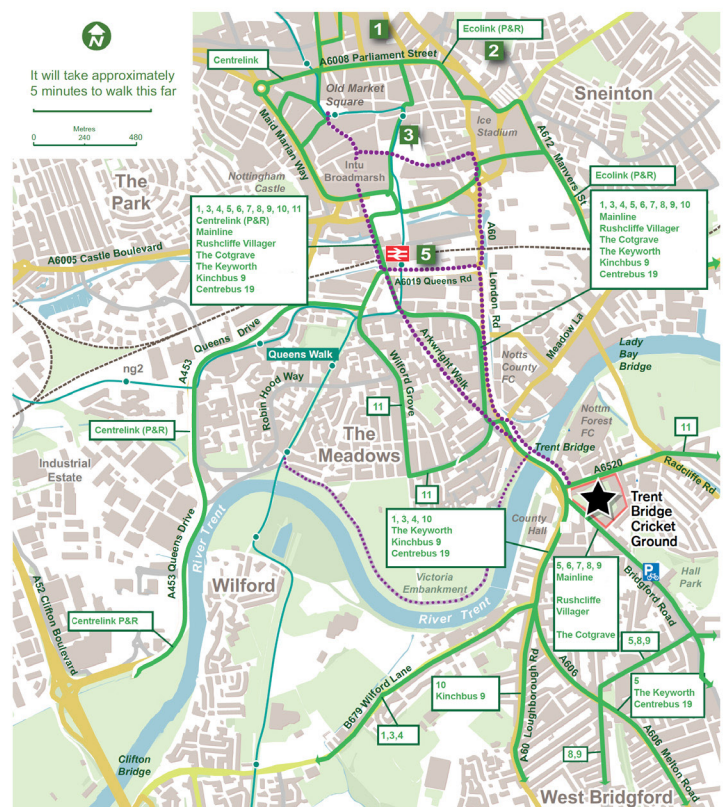
Nottingham City Transport buses 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 stop by the cricket ground. Exact fare required.

Ticketholders can enjoy a discounted Eventrider ticket for routes within Greater Nottingham in collaboration with Nottingham City Transport (NCT). Simply show your match ticket to the bus driver, after 9:30am, to take advantage of the £2.50 return offer.

ARRIVING BY TRAIN

Nottingham Railway Station is approximately a 20 minute walk from Trent Bridge, and regular buses run to the ground from the station. Train timetables and ticketing information can be found at nationalrail.co.uk

DRIVING TO TRENT BRIDGE

There are a number of well located and secure car parks around the city centre (see below for the postcodes). You can also make use of the Park and Ride facilities.

Park and Ride

Park and Ride sites offer a simple and cost-effective way to reach the city centre, and park your car.

One of the simplest options is to leave your car at the Clifton South Park and Ride Site, and take the tram to the Meadows Embankment stop. You can then walk along the river bank to the ground. Alternatively, all trams stop at the railway station, which is approximately 20 minute's walk from the ground.
